II. ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA:

4. Candidates seeking admission to the M. Phil (Clinical Social Work) Course should be Citizen of India and Native of Tamil Nadu.

5. Admission to M. Phil (Clinical Social Work) Course is open to both men and women candidates.

6.a.Candidates who have qualified from recognized **Universities in Tamil Nadu in both Undergraduate and Post Graduate Degree courses only are eligible.**

<p>1. The candidate who have obtained Master Degree in Social Work done under regular stream from a recognized University, specialized in Medical & Psychiatric Social Work.</p> <p>2. The candidate must secure not less than 55% (for OC/BC/BCM/MBC/DNC) and 50% (for SC/SCA/ST/PWD) marks in the aggregate of the Masters Degree as a whole.</p> <p>3. The candidate (specialized in Medical & Psychiatric Social work) working in Government Service are also eligible to apply for M.Phil (Clinical Social Work)</p> <p>4. Master Degree in Social Work done under regular scheme with specialization of Community Development, integrated social work, family and child welfare and human resource management from a recognized university.</p> <p>5. Preference will be given to Master Degree in Social Works done under regular stream (specialized in medical and psychiatric social work) from a recognized institute.</p> <p>6. If no eligible candidates with master degree in social works done under regular stream (specialized in medical and psychiatric social work) obtained from a recognized institute, the candidates with specialization of integrated social work, family and child welfare and human resource management obtained from a recognized university will be considered for M.Phil (Clinical Social Work).</p>
<p>7. The following categories will be treated as <u>Service candidates</u> for selection under the seats reserved exclusively for service candidates.</p> <p>(i) Candidates who have obtained Master Degree in Social Work (MSW), Specialized in Medical and Psychiatric Social Work, Master Degree in Social work with specialization of Community Development integrated social work, family and child welfare and human resource management course (from a recognized University) post graduates serving in Tamil Nadu Medical Service on a regular basis and who have completed two years of service as on <u>31-07-2016</u>.</p> <p>ii) Candidates who have obtained Master Degree in Social Work (MSW), Specialized in Medical and Psychiatric Social Work, Master Degree in Social work with specialization of Community Development integrated social work, family and child welfare and human resource management course (from a recognized University) post graduates who are approved probationers serving in local bodies will be considered as service candidates and must have completed 2 years of service as on <u>31-07-2016</u>.</p>

iii) First year/ semester to final year/semester Master Degree in Social Work (MSW) with Specialized in Medical and Psychiatric Social Work / Master Degree in Social work with specialization of Community Development, Integrated social work, family and child welfare and human resource management course (from a recognized University) Mark sheets issued by the University concerned.

iv) Community Certificate issued by the competent authority with Office Seal

v) Birth Certificate or copy of H.Sc., Certificate / School Leaving Certificate / College Leaving Certificate

vi) Attempt Certificate in Final Year Master Degree in Social Work (MSW) with Specialized in Medical and Psychiatric Social Work / Master Degree in Social work with specialization of Community Development in Integrated social work, family and child welfare and human resource management course (from a recognized University) from the College/University concerned.

11. The Government Orders issued and to be issued from time to time pertaining to any of the matters contained in the prospectus should be read as part and parcel of this prospectus and such terms and conditions in the Government Order are deemed to have been incorporated in this prospectus.

IV. MERIT LIST:

12. The merit list for admission of candidates for M. Phil (Clinical Social Work) Course will be made on the basis of total marks obtained by the eligible candidates in all the year / semester examinations of Master Degree in Social Work (MSW) with Specialized in Medical and Psychiatric Social Work / Master Degree in Social work with specialization of Community Development, Integrated social work, family and child welfare and human resource management course (from a recognized University) put together which is reduced to the base of 100 marks .

13. A common Merit List for the M. Phil (Clinical Social Work) course will be prepared by computing of academic marks for 100.

14. CALCULATION OF ACADEMIC MARKS :-

The total marks obtained must be reduced to the base of 100 marks and the weighted total marks obtained should be calculated accurate to two decimals. The academic marks is arrived at as shown below:-

ii) Candidates who have furnished the mark sheets only in grades, should furnish the actual marks obtained from the university. **If not, only the minimum marks of the grade will be considered.**

15. The Secretary, Selection Committee will publish the merit list in the websites www.tnhealth.org/ www.tn.gov.in. The candidates are advised to visit the websites everyday from the date of issue of application for information.

16. The candidates will be called for counselling as per their merit and they may exercise their option as per the eligibility norms mentioned in the prospectus, availability of seats and communal reservation in force.

17. DETERMINATION OF INTER-SE-MERIT

In case of two or more candidates obtaining equal marks out of a total of 100 marks, the inter se merit of such candidates shall be determined on the basis of the following order of preference.

- Least number of appearance in the final Semester of Master Degree in Social work (MSW) with Specialized in Medical and Psychiatric Social Work / Master Degree in Social work with specialization of Community Development Integrated social work, family and child welfare and human resource management course Examination from a recognized University.
- Total marks obtained in the final year examination of Master Degree in Social work (MSW) with Specialized in Medical and Psychiatric Social Work / Master Degree in Social work with specialization of Community Development Integrated social work, family and child welfare and human resource management course from a recognized University.
- Seniority in age will be given preference.

V. COUNSELLING PROCEDURE:

18. (1) a. Admission to M. Phil (Clinical Social Work) course shall be made by counselling on the basis of merit applying the various rules of reservation in force wherever applicable.

- The candidates will be called for counselling as per their merit and they may exercise their option as per the eligibility norms mentioned in the prospectus, availability of seats and communal reservation in force.
- Candidates who are absent at the time of counselling without a valid reason for absence will not be considered for admission. However, the Selection Committee reserves the right to permit the candidate to attend the counselling later, if seats are available, if a valid reason for absence is communicated to the Selection Committee before the commencement of the counselling. The Candidate so permitted can be admitted only if seats are available at the time of counseling when she/he actually attends.
- Due to unforeseen reasons ,if a candidate cannot attend the counselling on the specified date and time, he / she can **authorize** a representative to attend the counselling on his/ her

behalf. The authorized representative should produce an authority letter for allotment in the format given in the Annexure IV (A & B) along with **requisite original documents**. The allotment made to the authorized representative shall be binding on the candidate.

(19) Candidates selected for admission should give a declaration in the form given at the time of counselling that he / she is liable for forfeiture of selection / admission if suppression of facts are found at any time during or after admission to the course. The selection / admission shall be liable for cancellation based on the declaration at any time during or after the admission to the course. **Further he / she will not be allowed to apply for the M.Phil (Clinical Social Work) Degree Course for the succeeding Two Years.**

(20) Strict discipline should be maintained by the candidates for smooth conduct of counselling. If the candidates found indulging in any untoward activities, they will be debarred from the counselling and selection for the present and subsequent sessions.

(21) The candidates appearing for allotment by personal appearance should bring the **documents** enclosed along with application in original. **In any case candidates without original certificate / documents, shall not be allowed to participate in the counselling. Candidates who have deposited their original documents to the institution/ Universities and has come for counselling with a certificate stating that “ their original certificates are submitted with institution/ University” will NOT be allowed to participate in counselling.**

(22) Any change or modification and relevant information pertaining to this admission process will be made available immediately on the website (www.tnhealth.org / www.tn.gov.in). The candidates are instructed to frequently visit the website from the date of application till the end of counselling without fail and not to wait for counselling information to be received by post. All information including the date of counselling will be put up in the website. **Call letters can also be downloaded from the websites.** Candidates will be permitted for counselling accordingly.

VI. METHOD OF SELECTION AND ADMISSION

23. (1) The Selection will be made by counseling based on merit and by applying the Rule of Reservation/ Roster method followed by the Government of Tamil Nadu wherever applicable.

The rule of reservation shall be as follows:-

Open Competition	- 31%
Backward Class	- 30%
Most Backward / Denotified	- 20%
Scheduled Caste	- 18%
Scheduled Tribe	- 1%

BC, BCM, MBC, DNC, SC, SCA & ST are eligible for selection under open competition as per merit in addition to the reservation made for them.

Within the 30% reservation for Backward Classes 3.5% reservation will be provided for Muslims and 16% of seats out of 18% Quota earmarked to Scheduled Caste Arunthathiyar Community.

(2)a. Any remaining unfilled seats for want of adequate number of eligible candidates belonging to SCA community shall be filled by candidates belonging to SC community other than Arunthathiyar as per merit and vice versa. (GO (Ms) 55 P & AR Department dated 08.04.2010.)

b. Any remaining reserved seats in ST Quota for want of adequate number of eligible candidates belonging to ST community shall be allotted to candidates belonging to SC Community as per merit. (GO (Ms) No 77 Health & Family Welfare Department (MCA 1) dated 24.02.2011.)

c. Any remaining unfilled seats in BCM Community for want of adequate number of eligible candidates after exhausting the merit list shall be filled up on merit basis by

candidates belonging to BC community without exceeding the quota for BC community as a whole.

(MCA 1) dated 18.01.2012.)

d. Even after filling up of the required seats reserved for Arunthathiyars on preferential basis, if more number of qualified Arunthathiyars are available, such excess number of candidates of Arunthathiyars shall be entitled to compete with the Scheduled Castes other than Arunthathiyars in the inter-se merit among them(As per G.O.Ms.No.65, dated 27.5.2009 of P&AR(K) Department).

3) i. 50% of seats are reserved for service candidates, in addition to those service candidates selected in the open category. In case an odd number seat remains, that seat shall be filled by merit and communal reservation.

ii. If there are no eligible Service candidates opting for M. Phil (Clinical Social Work) course, the same will be allotted to eligible Non- Service candidates and Vice – Versa.

24. SEATS RESERVED FOR ORTHOPAEDICALLY PHYSICALLY DISABLED CANDIDATES:

3% of the total number of seats available in Government Institutions are reserved for the Orthopaedically Physically disabled candidates (only for locomotory disabilities of lower limbs). In the reservation of seats in the first instance, candidates with disability of lower limbs between 50% to 70% shall be considered and in case candidates are not available in that category then the candidates with 40% to 50% locomotory disabilities of the lower limbs will be considered.

The other conditions for admission into the course will be applicable as in the case of the general category.

The candidates are required to produce a certificate from the Medical Board of the Medical Colleges of the area concerned constituted for this purpose assessing the nature and the extent of physical disability in the format prescribed in the Annexure – IV (A & B). The Certificate must have been obtained within three months prior to submitting the application for seeking admission under this category. If the certificate has been obtained earlier, the application will be rejected.

The Medical Certificate issued by the District Medical Board of the area concerned for this purpose is subject to the confirmation of the Expert Committee constituted by the Director of Medical Education at the time of counseling.

The candidates seeking admission under this category should produce the full size photograph exhibiting the deformity.

Seats earmarked for the special categories will be allotted following the Horizontal Reservation. If no eligible candidates are available for the seats earmarked under special category, those seats will be added to general pool and allotted on merit basis.

Note:- (1) The candidates who have applied under this category will be required to undergo a second Medical Examination by a Medical Board constituted for the purpose by the Director of Medical Education to ascertain and confirm the nature and extent of Physical disability.

(2) a. Candidates with **any other disability other than the locomotory disability of the lower limb** will not be considered for admission to the course under this Special Category.

b. Both Upper Limbs, Vision and Hearing should be normal

(3) The decision of the Director of Medical Education in this regard will be final.

25. The candidates who are selected at the time of counselling shall pay the tuition fee in total prescribed in Clause 30 by way of Demand Draft drawn in favour of the

After the receipt of the joining report from the Dean , Stanley Medical College, this amount will be transferred to the Institution. This fee is not refundable if the candidate discontinues or does not join the course.</p>
<p>26. All candidates attending the counselling for M. Phil (Clinical Social Work) Degree Course will have to remit a non- refundable amount of ₹.500/- by means of Demand Draft drawn in favour of the Secretary, Selection Committee as processing fee.</p>

<p><u>VIII. HEPATITIS – B VACCINATION</u></p> <p>28. All the Selected candidates for admission to the M. Phil (Clinical Social Work) Degree course for 2014- 2015 session should take Hepatitis – B vaccination and submit a medical certificate from an authorized Medical Officer as proof thereof, to the Head of the Institution at the time of joining.</p> <p>Admission to the course will not be allowed by the Head of the Institution without the medical certificate. The candidate should take further doses at the prescribed intervals as required.</p>

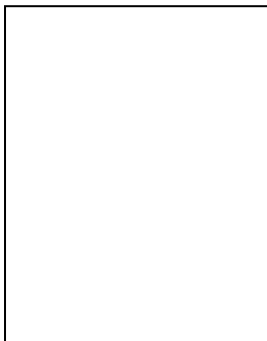

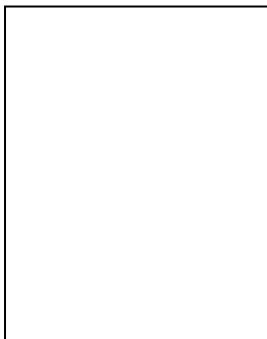
