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PREAMBLE

- 1. Sainik School Nagrota is a residential Public School, inaugurated on 22 Aug 1970. The school is located 18 kms away from the nearest railway station, Jammu on the banks of river Tawi and spread over 108 acres of land.
- 2. The School has excelled in its primary role as a feeder institution to the Armed Forces and has over 300 Ex-Nagrotians to its credit as officers in the Armed Forces. A good number of boys are IAS, IPS officers, Doctors and Engineers, serving not only in J&K but all over the country and abroad.

OBJECTIVE

- 3. The aim of the school is to prepare boys academically, physically and mentally for entry into the National Defence Academy/Indian Naval Academy and for other walks of life.
- 4. A sound character, esprit de corps, dedication, patriotic outlook and desire to serve the country are the qualities which Sainik Schools seek to promote.

The other objectives of the School are:-

- 5. (a) To remove regional imbalance in the officer cadre of the defence services.
 - (b) To develop qualities of body, mind and character which will enable the young boys of today to become good and worthy citizens of tomorrow.
 - (c) To bring public school education within the reach of the common man.
- 6. The motto of Sainik School Nagrota is:-

"KNOWLEDGE, BRAVERY & DISCIPLINE"

ADMINISTRATION

7. The administration of Sainik Schools is vested in an autonomous body of Board of Governors under the Chairmanship of the Union Minister for Defence, Ministry of Defence, Govt. of India. Day-to-day functioning of the School is administered by a Local Board of Administration (LBA), which ensures proper implementation of the policies laid down by the Board of Governors.

LOCAL BOARD OF ADMINISTRATION

8. Chief of Staff, Headquarters, 16 Corps is the Chairman of the Local Board of Administration. The Education Secretary to J&K Govt., Member of Parliament from Jammu constituency, Deputy Commissioner, Jammu, Director of School Education, Jammu region, CEO, Jammu and Principal, State Institute of Education, Jammu are the members of the Board. The Principal, Sainik School Nagrota acts as the Member Secretary of the LBA.

FACILITIES

9. Sainik School Nagrota has a flourishing campus with all the modern infrastructure including Academic Block, hostels, Auditorium, a large Assembly Hall, Science labs, Library and IT Cell. The spic and span classrooms are interlinked with LAN Network and Broadband Connectivity. The sophisticated Cadets' Mess caters to the cadets and staff round the session. The other facilities include living areas for boys, Gymnasium, Obstacle course, Guest House, Infirmary, Mini-Stadium, Squash and Tennis courts, other Sports and Games facilities of National Standards with round-the-clock power backup.





HOSTELS

10. The authorized strength of 465 boarders is accommodated in four hostels. Hostel Masters ensure personal comfort and healthy growth to mould boys into disciplined young men. Round-the-clock guidance is provided for total development of the personality of cadets. Each Hostel is administered by a Hostel Master. The Ward Boys and Hostel Masters remain in close contact with the cadets to look after them and monitor their growth and progress.



INFIRMARY

- 11. (a) The school has a fourteen bedded infirmary and cadets are treated by a qualified Doctor/Nursing Asstt. Sick cadets needing specialist treatment are referred to the Military Hospital/GMC, Jammu.
 - (b) Immunisation of the cadets must be completed before admission in the school by the parents as per WHO guidelines.
 - (c) The infirmary in school is only to provide first-aid to the sick cadets. The parents will be informed & it is their responsibility to take the sick child for further specialist treatment. After recovery parents will produce medical fitness certificate to the school authority.
 - (d) All the OPD, Laboratory, Radiology, Medical charges will beborne by the cadets/parents.



CADETS' MESS

12. A fully equipped modern Cadets' Mess provides wholesome vegetarian as well as non-vegetarian diet. Both 'Halal/Jhatka' meat are cooked and served to the boys separately. Hostel Masters and Ward Boys dine with cadets in a well furnished dining hall. Formal Dinner-nights are held frequently to inculcate Mess etiquettes and table manners. Ailing cadets are provided special diet as prescribed by the School Medical Officer/Assistant.



RECREATION

13. A Recreation Room forms an integral part of each hostel and is equipped with a colour television. Selected feature/ training films are screened in the school Auditorium at regular intervals. The School has a multifacility Auditorium with a capacity of 600 to cater for various co-curricular and recreational activities.











LIBRARY

14. The School has a well equipped Library and a furnished Reading Room. A large number of magazines and periodicals are regularly subscribed. Cadets are encouraged to stay abreast with day - to - day National and International news by making best use of the Reading Room.

SMART CLASSROOMS

15. Keeping abreast with the changing trends in Educational Technology and making the classroom experience more learner-centred, the school has Educomp Smart Classrooms with an aim to enable and empower the cadets as well as staff to connect, create and share knowledge.

SHOPPING COMPLEX

16 The school has a shopping complex to meet the day-to-day requirement of cadets and the staff. A canteen provides snacks, stationery, fruit juice, soft drink, etc. A well equipped tailor shop and barber shop are also available.

A well stocked CSD canteen caters to the requirement of the cadets and school staff.

ADMISSION PROCEDURE

- 17. (a) Applicants to apply online from 02 Jan 2018 to 24 Feb 2018 through website www.sainikschoolnagrota.com and submit requisite fee by online payment mode.
- (b) For offline mode, school prospectus with application form can be obtained from the school office on any working day between 0900 and 1600 hrs (Saturday up to 1400 hrs) from 02 January to 16 February 2018 on cash payment of Rs 400/- for General & Defence Candidates and Rs 250/- for SC/ST Candidates OR by sending Demand Draft drawn in favour of Principal Sainik School Nagrota for Rs 450/-for General & Defence candidates and Rs 300/- for SC/ST candidates respectively. Money order and IPO are not acceptable.
- (c) Application Form and Prospectus would be issued on individual name and it is not transferable. Forms would not be given to institution/coaching centers. No person is allowed to purchase more than two prospectuses at a time.
- (d). The application form complete in all respects must reach the school by 24 February 2018 addressed to Principal Sainik School Nagrota Jammu (J&K) Pin 181221. The school will not be responsible for rejection of application on account of delay, if any. The list of candidates issued with Admit Cards will be uploaded on school website www.sainikschoolnagrota.com on 05 April 2018, which can be downloaded by the candidate.

ELIGIBILITY

18. A boy is permitted to appear in Entrance Examination only once for the class in which admission is sought. Admission is confined to classes VI & IX for boys of age between 10-11 & 13-14 years respectively (i.e. from 02 Jul 2007 to 01 Jul 2008 for class VI and 02 Jul 2004 to 01 Jul 2005 for class IX). No relaxation of age limit is permissible under any circumstances. A boy should be VIII pass at the time of admission for class IX.

ENTRANCE EXAMINATION

(For Class VI & IX)

19. Admission test for class VI is conducted in English, Hindi and Urdu languages. The test for class IX is held only in English. The entrance test will be conducted on 15 April 2018 (Sunday) at the following centers:-


INTERVIEW

21. (a) The written test is followed by an interview carrying 50 marks for both classes VI and IX. Boys securing minimum 25% in each subject and 40% in aggregate are eligible to appear for the interview. However, only the shortlisted candidates will be called to appear for interview. Number of shortlisted candidates will be decided keeping in view the number of boys to be admitted in that particular academic session. The merit list is prepared on the basis of aggregate marks secured in the written test and interview. In case of a tie, marks for mathematics would be considered. In case of a tie again, the marks for English for class IX and Intelligence Test for class VI will be considered and thereafter, the marks for General Science for class IX and Language for class VI. If a tie still occurs, the boy younger in age will be selected. Merely qualifying in the written test does not confer any right for admission. Boys are selected strictly in accordance with the final merit list. Number of boys to be selected depends on the number of existing vacancies.

(b) The result of written test is published on the school website and in the leading local as well as National newspapers. In addition, those qualify in written examination are intimated individually.

RESERVATION OF SEATS

22. 15% and 7.5% seats are reserved for admission of boys belonging to Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes respectively and 25% of remaining seats are reserved for the boys of service personnel including ex-servicemen. Balance seats will be allotted as per Sainik Schools Society, Rules & Regulations.



MEDICAL EXAMINATION

23. All boys, before admission to Sainik School, are medically examined by a Board consisting of Medical Specialists. Standards of health and medical fitness for admission are determined by the standards prescribed for NDA keeping in view the tender age of the boys and scope of their growth. In case of rejection on medical grounds, the parents can appeal in writing against the decision of Medical Board through the School after paying fee of Rs.100/-(Rs 50/for SC/ST) for holding a Review Medical board, within 15 days after declaration of medical results.

SCHOLARSHIPS

24. The State Government as well as Ministry of Defence award scholarships to the boys studying in Sainik Schools on merit-cum means basis. The award of scholarship is, however, subject to the decision of scholarship granting authorities and the school does not give any guarantee in this regard. Details regarding the award of scholarships are as follows:-

ACADEMIC SESSION

25. The academic session of Sainik School Nagrota is from 1st April to 31st March of the succeeding year.

PROMOTION

26. For promotion to next class a minimum of 33% of marks in each subject and 40% in aggregate is required for all classes.

VACATION

27. All children are required to leave the school during the vacations. The schedule of departure is intimated to the parents in advance before the start of vacation.

The School has two long breaks in a year:-

- (a) Summer Break commencing from first week of June
- (b) Winter Break commencing from third week of December.

LEAVE

28. Leave for attending routine and social obligations during session is discouraged.

CO-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

29. The school provides ample scope for development of creative skills of cadets in fine arts and crafts. Opportunities are provided to the boys for participating in Debates, Dramatics, Music, Art, Craft, Photography, Trekking etc. Educational trips form an integral part of training. A large number of activities under the Socially Useful Productive Works (SUPW) are held with a view to make the boys self-reliant and appreciate the dignity of labour and self help.



NATIONAL CADET CORPS

30. NCC is compulsory for all boys in the school. A half Senior Company and a Junior Division Company of NCC are exclusively available in the school. Qualified instructional staff from the Army and Navy is posted to impart NCC training. The school has earned a place of distinction by contributing majority of the cadets from the school for J&K contingent at Republic Day Parade at New Delhi.

(a) Our boys are selected to participate in the Youth Exchange Programme organised by the Directorate of N.C.C.

COMPETITIONS

- 31. Cadets participate in various academic competitions and Games & Sports tournaments all over the country.
- 32. INTER-HOUSE TOURNAMENTS are held in:-
- (a) **Academics:** Debate, Declamation, Painting, Essay Writing, Story Writing, Spelling, Dramatics, Quiz etc.

(b) **Games & Sports:** Football, Hockey, Volleyball, Basketball, Athletics, Cross-Country, etc.

EXCURSION

33. Continued efforts are made to send boys on excursions/ Educational Tours to important Defence establishments.

MODE OF PAYMENT

35. All payments to the school are to be made by means of crossed demand draft drawn in favour of Principal, Sainik School Nagrota, payable at Nagrota, Jammu. Receipt signed by both the cashier and the Adm Officer only are valid.

ESCORTING OF BOYS

36. Parents of boys studying in classes VI to VIII are required to collect their wards from the school. Boys studying in classes IX to XII are permitted to leave the school on their own. Efforts are made to send cadets of classes IX to XII in groups but without escorts. Parents are expected to inform school authorities in case their ward does not reach home as scheduled.

INTERVIEW WITH THE STAFF & PARENTS TEACHERS MEET

37. Parents desirous of meeting the Principal and other staff members are advised to take prior appointment. Interviews will be granted during working hours only in the office. Parents are advised not to meet the Principal, Vice Principal, Adm officer and other members of staff at their residences. Parents are not permitted to visit Hostels. PTM is held on quarterly basis and dates for the same are given in Annual School Calendar issued to Cadets before the start of each Academic Session.

CASHAND VALUABLES

38. Cadets are not allowed to be in possession of cash and valuables such as gold chains, rings mobiles, MP-3/MP-4 players, tape recorders, etc. Money Order addressed to the cadets directly in their names are not accepted in the school.

PROGRESS REPORTS

39. Cadets are regularly assessed in scholastic & non-scholastic areas as per CBSE guidelines. Due weightage is also given to class work. A detailed progress report is sent to the parents to apprise them of their wards progress in various spheres of school life during the term.

WITHDRAWAL

- 40. (a) Parents of cadets paying full fee can withdraw their wards by giving two months' notice before the commencement of the following term. Failure to give such notice will entail forfeiture of the caution money. The parents of cadets receiving scholarship can withdraw their wards by refunding the total amount of scholarship received by them during their entire stay in the school.
- (b) Principal can order withdrawal of a cadet from the school on the grounds of poor academic performance/ poor progress. The fees in respect of such cadet are not refundable. Principal can also detain a cadet once in the same class during the orientation period i.e. in classes VI to VIII, if his progress is not found satisfactory. Second failure in class VI to VIII and any failure in classes IX to XI will result in automatic withdrawal of the cadets from the school and immediate stoppage of scholarship. The Principal can also order withdrawal of a boy on disciplinary grounds. In such cases, the parents will have to refund the total scholarship amount received by their wards during their stay in the school. Order of withdrawal by the Principal can also be resorted to for non-payment of fees.

RAGGING

41 As per Supreme Court guidelines ragging is totally banned in school. All parents have to submit an affidavit at the time of admission.


GENERAL
